

# PCC Policy for the Interment of Ashes into the Garden of Remembrance at All Saints' Church, Marple

Whose ashes can be interred in the Garden of Remembrance at All Saints' Church, Marple?

- Residents in the Parish or those who have resided in the Parish at some point
- Those whose names are on, or have previously been on, the church Electoral Roll
- Those dying in the Parish
- The Incumbent can also allow anyone else to be interred in the Garden of Remembrance, but they should get guidance from the PCC. If the Incumbent declines to allow the interment of a person who has no right of interment as defined above, the Incumbent's decision shall be final.
- There are no permanent memorials in the Garden of Remembrance
- Names will be officially recorded in the Burial Register, including a grid reference
- There is a Book of Remembrance for anyone interred in the Garden of Remembrance

Who can conduct the service for the interment of ashes?

- A Service of Interment of Ashes must be a Christian Service and conducted by a priest of the Church of England, or a minister of a church in communion with the Church of England, or at the discretion of the Incumbent
